Zoning Advisory Panel (ZAP) Workplan Process and Timeline* ZAP Charges:

- Assist Staff with the drafting of regulations for the Urban Residential Mixed-Use Zone
 District (A high level of collaboration with the City is needed regards infrastructure
 planning); and
- Assist Staff with the drafting of regulations for the Suburban Residential Mixed-Use
 Zone District; and
- Suggest potential options to address the 3 Key Issues (Water, Roads, and Fire) in the Rural Residential Mixed-Use District, in lieu of the approved (but with implementation deferred) 10-acre minimum lot size / density.

Stage 2: Identification and Cataloging of Community Concerns and Values (July and August)

A. STEEP Analysis – (Social, Technological, Economic, Environmental and Political) Technical and Environmental – (6/23/21 and 7/14/21) Economic (7/28/21 and 8/11/21)

B. Development of assessment criteria – using the technical information from Stage 1 and the outline of concerns and values form Stage 2A, develop a set of working criteria that will enable the ZAP to assess and consider proposal options.

Stage 3: Identification and Assessment of Potential Zoning Proposals (Early September – Late October)

- Idea and Option Generation
- Option Content Development Initiate proposals to a level where they can be assessed using the criteria from Stage 2B

- Step-wise assessment of options using the criteria
- Prioritization and selection of proposals that best align with the criteria
- Endorse and refer final recommendations to County staff for advancement to the City-County Planning Board and County Commission.

Additional Steps

Public outreach and engagement

- -Public Comment at each meeting
- -In addition to ongoing communications, the ZAP will also solicit input and feedback from the public minimally at two stages:
 - 1. 1) As the ZAP approaches the end of Stage 1 solicit feedback about any other topics citizens and stakeholders have questions about.
 - 2. 2) As the ZAP approaches the conclusion of stage 2B, seek feedback about any concerns among citizens and stakeholders that did not emerge as a part of the STEEP analysis.
