Notice is hereby given that the Board of County Commissioners of Lewis and Clark County, Montana are soliciting proposals from qualified engineering firms for a joint infrastructure study between the County and the City of Helena for the extension of city infrastructure and connection of existing and future non-city infrastructure to city infrastructure within the urban standards boundary/urban growth area.

Minority and women-owned businesses are encouraged to participate in this solicitation.

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals, to add or delete items and/or quantities, to waive any irregularities and/or informalities in any proposal, to postpone the acceptance of the proposal and the award of contract for a period not to exceed 30 working days from the date of the proposal opening and to further advertise the RFP, and to make the award that is in the best interests of Lewis and Clark County. Lewis and Clark County may reject any proposal that is not within the County's budget resources for this project or not in compliance with all prescribed proposal procedures and requirements. Lewis and Clark County may reject for good cause any and all proposals upon a finding of the County that it is in the public's interest to do so. This project is subject to the availability of funds. The initial contract term and any renewal periods are subject to negotiation.

This solicitation is being offered in accordance with federal and state statutes governing procurement of professional services. Accordingly, Lewis and Clark County reserves the right to negotiate an agreement based on fair and reasonable compensation for the scope of work and services proposed. Proposals become the property of Lewis and Clark County. The County is not responsible for paying costs associated with preparing a proposal.
